



DATA SUMMARY: RESEARCH & GRADUATE STUDIES



The CVM houses the Biomedical Sciences (BIMS) Graduate Program, the Science & Technology Journalism master's program, the Veterinary Public Health & Epidemiology master's program, and the Interdisciplinary Degree Program of Toxicology.

The college was home to **281** graduate students in FY18—41.6% higher than the national average of 117 for colleges of veterinary medicine. The newly admitted Black graduate students comprised almost 7% of the cohort—nearly twice the percentage at Texas A&M. Newly admitted Hispanic or Latino graduate students comprised 16% of the cohort—substantially higher than the percentage at Texas A&M.


Average Annual Assistantship Rates Over Time




- The BIMS Graduate Program requires financial support through an annual stipend for all full-time enrolled master's thesis and PhD students at a minimum annual amount of \$16,500 and \$18,000, respectively. The majority of CVM research students receive support from an assistantship, which recently reached an average close to that of NIH predoctoral trainees at \$24,816 per year. Non-thesis option master's are generally totally self-funded.
- We Serve Every Texan Every Day through Global One Health—the intersection of human, animal, and environmental health—with a central emphasis on basic, clinical, and translational research and discovery.
- Our five current areas of research distinction are: 1) Biomedical Genomics & Bioinformatics, 2) Diagnostics & Therapeutics, 3) Infection, Immunity & Epidemiology, 4) Physiology & Developmental Biology, and 5) Toxicology & Environmental Health.
- Total *extramural research expenditures were \$35M in 2018*—twice the average of North American veterinary colleges. This number represents a 63% increase compared to 2008.
- NIH is funding over \$15 million in grants to individual investigators in the college for FY19.
- Our research often reaches journals of double-digit impact factor such as Cell, the Nature family (including N. Biotechnology, N. Communications, N. Genetics, N. Microbiology, and N. Rev. Endocrinology) in addition to the flagship Nature, and Science.
- In less than five years, the BIMS non-thesis master's program has tripled the number of students it prepares annually for professional schools in the health sciences.
- Thirteen CVM researchers rank among the 100,000 most cited scientists—with two in the top 1,000!
- Our **portfolio of external research funding includes** federal sources such as the **NIH**, **NSF**, **USDA and DoD**, and private sources include **Zoetis**, **Kleberg Foundation**, **American Heart Association**, **and the Winn Feline Foundation**.
- Clinical trials enrolling our Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital patients have grown over the past decade, have been funded by NIH and DoD, and are part of a growing movement to develop win-wins for human and animal health.


FY18 Percentage of Research Expenditures by Funding Source

FY18 Research Expenditures by School






Research Expenditures Over Time
